



All Saints Church

Nagoya *Kibo* (Hope) Church has reached its 100 year milestone of evangelism in Nagoya. Along with its kindergarten and All Saints International Church, Nagoya Kibo held a celebration to mark this milestone. All Saints Church provided our elementary school ukulele band of about 10 students who lead the group in singing *Jesus Loves Me* and *Ha Ha Ha Hallelujah*. All Saints Church's blue grass band with John participating on vocals sang *I'll Fly Away* and *What a Friend We Have in Jesus*. About 120 were in attendance for a time of food, fellowship and testimony. Dr. Yoshi shared in Japanese about how as a young man he came to an English speaking fellowship and found faith in Jesus. The Japanese pastor, Suetake Sensei, announced that John would be providing English support for the kindergarten. In response to this announcement, many of the attendees clapped in agreement and joy. Later in the day, All Saints had its English worship and six non-Christians were in attendance.

KeiAi Academy

Two prospective students contacted us about joining KeiAi Academy from the new school year in the spring. We have had contact with both of their families for several years and both are from non-Christian homes. We will not know their final decision until the spring, but we are honored they are considering us. KeiAi Academy went to Guam and before going, John met with one family whose daughter was traveling with us. We talked about the trip and educational issues concerning her daughter, and then we prayed. It is such an honor to pray in Japan with Japanese people who do not know Jesus. JEMS as a missionary agency has the motto: *Jesus to the Japanese Everyday Everywhere*. We are glad to be a small part of that greater work, praying with one person at a time.



Global Outreach and Connection

The last week of October and the first week of November we visited the Lutheran Church of Guam. John enjoyed representing JEMS, KeiAi Academy and Nagoya All Saints Church while there. Aira, a KeiAi Academy student, was traveling with us. At 15, it was her first time to travel abroad without her family. It was also her first time to attend a Christian worship service. John preached on Jesus resurrecting Lazarus from the dead. After the service, we visited with another couple who are an international marriage family like ourselves. Tamami, the wife/mother, and her two daughters were baptized 5 years earlier. John has said that, "As Kazumi, who is also an adult convert, sat at the table with Tamami and Aira, I was impressed by God's faithfulness."
